Between an election year and a national pandemic, 2020 has been a year full of uncertainties. After what seemed like the longest waiting game, Joe Biden and Kamala Harris won the race to the White House. Along with a new President, there were some new laws passed by the state of California including Proposition 24 and Proposition 17.

The Consumer Privacy Rights Act, Proposition 24, is a new law that California voters passed that will make it harder for Facebook and Google to track user's activity through third party sources. Proposition 24 is only active in the state of California, but will apply to all of the United States because of the huge influence California has on the tech industry. The point of the law is to strengthen existing privacy measures that allows consumers to stop outside businesses from selling or sharing their personal information to third parties. Along with Proposition 24, California voters passed Proposition 17 that will return the right to vote to those on parole. Proposition 17 currently allows those on probation the right to vote, but last Tuesday California voters approved the new measure. According to the Los Angeles Times, this will return about 50,000 people the right to vote. 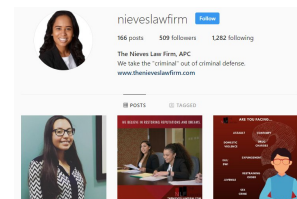
